YORK — Good things come to those who wait.

This cliché proved itself in game one when the Cornerstone Legion Senior baseball team come away with a 7-6 win against Lincoln Exhaust Pros. The Lincoln team is affiliated with Lincoln Southeast High School.

Tim Adams started on the mound for York. Exhaust Pros quickly tagged Adams for a back to back single and double in the first inning but a flyout to Nick Wiehn at second base and a

strike out ended the Lincoln threat. The next two innings of work produced three bases on balls and some hard hit outs but no runs for the Lincoln team after three innings.

The Bankers' bats were quiet the first two innings when Greg Wieting started off the third inning with a single to left field. Jess Gaver came back with a single of his own to left field to bring Wieting in for

the first score of the game.

Gaver then took over pitching duties in the top of the fourth inning. He struck out two batters and got a ground ball out. After a three up and three down half inning offensively it was Gaver back to the mound for the Cornerstone team. Lincoln Exhaust Pros got a rally started early with a leadoff walk followed by three singles in the next four batters to produce two runs and take a 2-1 lead.

Offensively the York Senior team had put the ball in play a number of times only striking out three times in the first five innings.

"We just had to be patient at the plate," Co-Head Coach LeRoy Ott said.

In the sixth inning it appeared as though the players from Lincoln were ready to put the York team away. A leadoff passed ball on the third strike led to the batter reaching first base.

The next batter, Jordan Jacob, hit a single to right field and had the Exhaust Pros in business with runners on first and

second with no outs. A strikeout and a base on balls later had the bags maxed out with the players from Lincoln. At the time of an electronic scoreboard malfunction the Exhaust Pros hit the lights out of the ball with back to back two RBI doubles by Lincoln's Jordan Hotovy and Christian Chadwick to give the Exhaust Pros a commanding 6-1 lead.

The York Cornerstone Seniors went to bat in their bottom half of the sixth possibly not knowing what the real score was. Gaver started the inning with a

# Syracuse splits with Blues

## Junior Blues split with Syracuse

YORK — The intensity that York Junior Blue head coach Duane Bodtke saw in game one of his teams doubleheader at Levitt Stadium against the Syracuse juniors, failed to show back up for the York team in the second game.

After York Cornerstone Junior Blue starting pitcher David Adams handcuffed the Syracuse juniors on just two hits in the opener, as the York team won the game in six innings 10-2.

In the night cap it appeared the York junior Blue would strike early and often as they strung together four consecutive singles and took an early 1-0 lead.

But what looked like a promising start would be squashed when Syracuse shortstop put an end to the rally as he tagged out Anthony Smith between second and third, and then threw onto first to get Andy Pinneo with the double play.

That was all Syracuse starting pitcher Tyler Kreifels would need as he and Tyler Bassinger blanked the York Cornerstone junior Blue team the remainder of the night and picked up the 8-1 win to earn the split.

In the first game, Bodtke said that Adams gave the team just what they needed with the complete game win.

"It was great he could pitch the whole game. Always in a doubleheader you never know how long your pitching is going to hold up, and he really got us

off to a great start," explained Bodtke. "Both offensively and defensively we were playing at a higher level than we had played all season long. In the second game it just wasn't the same level of play. It was kind of a typical junior game and we just never did pick it up."

In the first game Adams tossed 101 pitches with 53 of those finding the strike zone. He allowed only two hits and he struck out five, while walking four.

Offensively the two teams were tied 1-1 at the end of the first inning, but in the York third, Jordan Hansen ripped an RBI single to score Bodtke who had doubled to make it 2-1.
